A true pioneer in the sport, from the cruiser days to the 1990 World Championship Downhill in Durango. Gary Fisher's office has been the Marin County single track for the last sixteen years. A

tough job, but someone had to be developing the super stable Evolution steering system, extra wide hipstay

chainstays, right and left toe clips, (why didn't I think of that?) and the ever popular Trax tire series. You can feel confident that Gary has had every Fisher model in his office a lot, making sure they

When Gary Fisher drafted this E-Stay bike, he didn't just stick the chainstays up in the air and call it done. He redesigned the whole frame. Incorporating a curved seat tube allowing ultra short chainstays, a longer top tube, steeper head angle, and reduced fork offset. Blended together, the Montare is an explosive climber capable of near vertical ascents. You'll be amazed when you throttle down on the pedals, the Montare accelerates without hesitation. \$809.95

Paragon

Most bikes in this price range are oriented towards the racer. Gary's Paragon, however, is hankering for an expedition. The Fisher designed Quad butted tubing makes day-long rides comfortable. Rear rack braze-ons and low profile cantilever brakes are ready for your panniers. Gnarly trails are easily smoothed out, and critical steering parts last longer with the six part Evolution steering system, so you won't be walking home. \$1295.95



A techie's dream. Just listen to this description of the CR-7's frame. The main triangle is made with SuperSize Easton Varilite double-butted cross-ovalized 7005 aluminum; it's mechanically joined to a Cro-Mo rear triangle. Translated to English that means the CR-7 has a super smooth ride that can't be matched by any steel or aluminum frame alone. Combining Suntour's new XC Comp group with the new lighter frame adds a more refined feel for '91. \$1449.95

The Rhino Evolution is the lightest aluminum stem made. By using the larger 1.25" size Fisher can use less material, and still maintain a strong, stiff stem. Choosing the right size...

In general we recommend that you have 1 to 3 inches of clearance between your crotch and the top tube when you stand over the bike. The more you ride off-road, or the more aggressive you are, the more clearance you need. A very loose guideline is to take your leg length and subtract 13. To be sure give us a call. 



ProCaliber

A couple of long times ago, the ProCal was invincible on the race circuit, setting new standards in lightweight frame design and custom component selection. The ProCal delivered a near mythical ride: springy and lively, with trend setting geometry that's still being copied today. A couple of leaps back to the present finds us saying the same thing. A frame made with Tange Superlight Quad-butted Prestige tubing. A component group hand picked by Gary Fisher including parts from Suntour, Dia-Compe, Sugino, and of course Fisher. A track record that says "Take me to the races"! \$1339.95

Gemini Tandem

If you're like me and the little lady you're tired of being beaten up every hill, right? So you gotta figure if only you had a tandem you'd get to the top of every hill at the same time, even slightly ahead if she let you be the captain. The key factor with tandems, though, is not having to mortgage the house. Gary's considered this and designed the Gemini around a tough True Temper tandem frame. Then he hand picked the Shimano Deore DX drivetrain and Suntour XC Comp brake system as the best performance for value components available. Twice the fun is only a phone call away. \$1659.95

RS-1

Some think the only reason to climb the hill is the exhilarating descent to come. With a fifteen year old Repack downhill record we think Gary Fisher might be that kind of guy. So when he got together with motorcycle suspension wiz Mert Lawill to design the RS-1 – lookout! Two inches of front and rear travel give absolute control to the rider. Not only do you dust your friends on the downhill, but climbing traction is also improved. A Campagnolo rear disk brings you to a safe halt. (Available in late summer) \$3099.95
